## WHAT IS LEADERSHIP ROSEVILLE?

Leadership Roseville is the Roseville Area Chamber of Commerce's community leadership program — a year-long, immersive experience designed to develop engaged, informed, and connected leaders across Roseville and Placer County.

Each year, a select cohort of professionals participates in monthly full-day sessions, a two-day kickoff retreat, and a meaningful community service project.

Participants gain behind-the-scenes knowledge about public agencies and community based organizations that serve the Roseville area. They also get access to the people, institutions, and ideas shaping our region and leave with a network that lasts a lifetime. The program is designed to educate and develop effective community leaders who will help create a spirit of cooperation for the resolution of future community challenges.

### TUITION

The tuition fee for Leadership Roseville is \$1,750. A \$50 non-refundable fee is due upon submittal of the application; you will receive an invoice once your application is submitted. Payment in full of tuition must be received prior to the first session. Tuition is non-refundable.
